

RARE, THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES, FORESTS OF RECOGNIZED IMPORTANCE (FORI)

There are no state mapped rare, threatened or endangered species or natural communities present on this parcel, but if identified will be managed in accordance with recommended guidelines. No state listed winter deer yards or mapped wetlands are present on this property. There are also no high conservation value forests, or Forests of Recognized Importance (FORI), on this parcel.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has listed the northern long-eared bat as threatened and established a new rule, "called the 4(d) Rule, to protect the bat population during its most vulnerable life stages in areas where the disease(white-nosed syndrome), is present." Although there are no maternal roost trees or winter hibernaculum known on this property, this area is in the Long-eared bat's natural range. Follow recommendations set up in the 4d rule regarding management activities, which are included as part of this management plan.

Research on all Rare, Threatened and Endangered as well as wetlands, and other wildlife habitat, was provided through the VT ANR Atlas website, and/or contact with VT Fish and Wildlife biologists.
